Front Door Locking Procedure

Wesmor Public High School will be locking the front doors during instruction time. The doors will be locked from 9:00 to 11:45 and at 12:35 to end of the day (the front doors will be open for breaks and lunchtime, when school staff members are supervising common school areas).

Please ensure that students have arrived at school prior to the start of morning or afternoon classes. Morning classes start at 8:55 and afternoon classes start at 12:30. If a student is late they will have to enter through the front doors by using the intercom system (located on the south side of the front entrance) and sign in at the office.

We welcome all visitors to stop in at the office during class hours so we can meet you and support our focus of providing uninterrupted learning time. If you have any questions please feel free call the school. We will work hard to keep the communication open between parents, students and teachers, however, we honour learning time and try not to interrupt classes with pages and calls to the classrooms during class time. You are more than welcome to leave a message with the Secretaries in the office, and they will make sure that the student or teacher gets your message, or feel free to call during any of the breaks or over lunch.
